

# 2023 REVIEW OF THE YEAR

### From the Chairman

2023 seems to have passed by with great speed and it seems impossible that we are nearly at Christmas and looking forward to another year. By the end of the year our membership stood at 90—17 of which are Patrons. FOAS membership is not confined to Emberton, but it is true to say that the majority of members live in the village. # HOW WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO HELP IN 2023

This year FOAS funds have been used to support the PCC's request to improve the Church lighting. New floodlights have been installed in the Churchyard which improve safety and show the church as a beautiful focal point in the village through the winter months. The cost was approx.

£3,500 and carried out by CLS Electrical Services Ltd, specialists in installing lighting in churches and historical buildings.

We have also agreed to fund

replacement high level lighting inside the church, improving the level of light and removing the need to climb long ladders to change light bulbs!
